An incredibly Evial and Narsty-type Villain in Australian fannish lore, out to destroy all fandom in as viclent a manner as possible.

Beam. Jim

See under "Jim Beam."

Blog

What was being consumed in large quantities at late last night's party. It has been known to cause Being Silly.

Bozo

What Minneapolis Fandom is fond of noting that we're all, on this bus.

Comment Hooks

Comment-inspiring lines within fanzines.

Crudzine

A fanzine of sorts (derivation obvious).

Egoscanning

Scanning a fanzine in search of one's own name in print.

Etchings

Come up to our art show room and we'll show you some, heh heh.

FIAWOL

Fandom Is A Way Of Life. (But then, what isn't?)

Fannish

All-purpose adjective describing activities and attitudes of fans.

Fanzine

An amateur magazine produced by a fan: dittoed, mimeoed. printed, or what-have-you. Circulation may range from near-zero up to thousands; quality from the supraprofessional down to abominable; material from anything sideways to anything else.

Fhan

Ultra-fannish (also "Faaan," etc.); the opposite of Sercon.

Foster's Lager

The best-known (to outsiders) Australian beer: well-known because Australians keep the good stuff and export this to Americans, who will drink anything.

Jerry Pournelle On windows, see INFERNO, by Larry Niven and Pournelle.

Jim Beam

Sercon Serious and Constructive: a compliment or an insult, or both, depending on intention and views of the user.

Slushpile Reader Reader in charge of examining unsolicited manuscripts to the professional magazines. They tend to die young.

Tucker See under "Beam, Jim."

Zeppelins The only fannish flying machines. Airplanes are Right Out.
