After the girls moved out of their old orphanage, the boys set to work to convert it into a school. The main work involves installing partitions in the old dormitory to make classrooms and a staff room, together with fitting new lights and fans. The grounds are also being given a makeover with a brush cutter (weed whipper or strimmer) and two rooms are being painted. The work should be completed just in time for the start of the new year on 6th June.

Latest estimates predict that we should have 59 pupils starting the year in 7 class groups and a staff comprising 6 local teachers and 6 foreign volunteers.
