• **Job Performance.** 53% of registered voters nationwide approve of the job President Bush is doing in office. This represents a 17% decrease in President Bush's approval rating since April of this year.

Handling the Situation in Iraq. The most dramatic shift has occurred in voters' perceptions of President Bush's handling of the situation in Iraq. 48% of registered voters approve of the job President Bush is doing there, a drop of 28% since last April.

Nature of the Sample: 1,004 Americans

This survey was conducted on October 27^{th} through 29^{th} , 2003. 1,004 adults 18 years of age or older within the continental United States were interviewed by telephone. Telephone numbers were selected based upon a list of telephone exchanges from throughout the nation. The exchanges were selected to ensure that each region was represented in proportion to its population. The results of the entire survey are statistically significant at $\pm 3\%$. There are 788 registered voters. The results for this sub-sample are statistically significant at $\pm 3.5\%$. There are 339 Democrats or Democratic leaning Independents in the sample. The results for this sub-sample are statistically significant at $\pm 5.5\%$. The margin for error increases for cross-tabulations.
