WOMEN IN ENGINEERING SCHOLARSHIPS 2003

Inaugurated in 1992, the Women in Engineering Scholarships are part of the ABC's program of positive action strategies to increase the representation of women in the broadcast engineering and technology field.

The Scholarships are awarded annually to women in the final years of an Electrical Engineering Degree, Diploma or similar. Successful applicants receive a cash prize of \$1500 and industry experience in technology areas of the ABC.

Applications should include:

- a letter outlining why you would value this scholarship
- details of your educational history plus any employment or industry experience
- a copy of your academic record.
- a letter of support for your application from the Senior Head Teacher
 Department of Electrical Engineering (or equivalent)

The Scholarships are open to Australian citizens, permanent residents, New Zealand citizens who have entered Australian on a valid passport or those visitors who have a valid temporary business visa allowing employment.

Eligible applicants will be called for an interview by a panel which selects the recipient. Scholarship winners will receive their awards at a suitable occasion in a local ABC office before the end of the calendar year.
