Four years ago, just 537 votes decided the presidential election. This year, the vote could be just as close, which means each vote carries unprecedented weight and we must do everything we can to get voters to the polls. A good start is right in our own homes.

The DNC's new Family Voting Plan encourages families to work together to ensure that every family member votes on Election Day.

Following the step-by-step plan, family members lead others in voter registration, verifying polling places and providing needed assistance and rides to the polls. The web-based plan is also built to travel and can be distributed at family reunions and community or group meetings.
