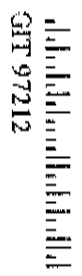

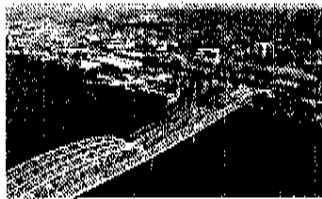

Project Overview

The Columbia River Crossing is a bridge, transit and highway improvement project of the Oregon and Washington departments of transportation. The project is designed to improve safety and reduce congestion on a five-mile segment of Interstate 5 (I-5) between Vancouver and Portland. The CRC project will build a replacement I-5 bridge across the Columbia River with a wider pedestrian and bicycle path and extend light rail transit to Vancouver. The project will also improve seven highway interchanges between SR 500 in Vancouver and Columbia Boulevard in Portland.
