MIT is asking all students to answer a brief survey, sponsored by the Chancellor in collaboration with MIT Violence Prevention and Response (VPR) and MIT Medical. The purpose of this study is to collect data from current undergraduates and graduates as well as recent alumni on the social and cultural climate at MIT. This survey is made up of several sections that ask about your knowledge, opinions, and beliefs on certain subjects, including how to react in social situations, perceptions, and experience with sexual situations, as well as how you view various aspects of MIT culture.

This survey should take most students 10-15 minutes to complete. This survey is completely ANONYMOUS and VOLUNTARY. Your response will NOT be part of any academic, medical, or disciplinary record. You do NOT have to participate in this survey, and if you do choose to participate, you may skip any question you are not comfortable answering and may exit the survey at any time.
