6 Accidental Release Measures

Personal Precautions, Protective Equipment and Emergency Procedures:

Wear PVC gloves, full length protective clothing and safety boots. Evacuate all non-essential personnel from affected area.

Environmental Precautions: In the event of a major spill, prevent spillage from entering drains or water courses.

Methods and Materials for Containment and Cleaning Up:

Stop leak if safe to do so and absorb spill with sand, earth, vermiculite or some other absorbent material. Collect the spilled material and place into a suitable container and top with hydrated lime. Decontaminate spill area with hydrated lime scattered over the spill prior to rinsing off with water.

For quantities up to 50L of product bury in a secure land fill site. For quantities greater than 50L seek advice from the manufacturer before attempting disposal. Contain in a secure location until disposal method is established.

7 Handling and Storage

Precautions for Safe Handling:

Use of safe work practices are recommended to avoid eye or skin contact and inhalation of vapours. Food, beverages and tobacco products should not be stored or consumed where this material is in use. Always wash hands before smoking, eating, drinking or using the toilet. Wash contaminated clothing and other protective equipment before storage or re-use.

This is based on the NOAEL of 0.7 mg/kg/day, the level determined to show no effects during long term exposure for the most sensitive indicators and the most sensitive species.
