finding and to further determine whether the National Party and State Party

may implement an alternative Party-run delegate selection system which does

not conflict with the National Party rules, without running afoul of the laws of

the state of Florida.

Wherefore, the Plaintiff, Victor DiMaio, requests that this court assume

jurisdiction and enter a declaratory judgment determining the rights and

obligations of the parties herein.
