Voice or call notes and method of delivery: Silent Behavior: Flock flushed from edge of marsh, flow to electrical lines and poles and then on to trees. Habitat: Edge of marsh, pasture, What similar species might it have been and how were these eliminated: Common grackle much smaller, females to dull black rather than What experience have you had with this and similar species: I have observed great-tailed grackles several times in the San Luis valley and each of the past three years near Clifton, Co. Common grackles nest in my neighborhood. Iknow both birds well. Books, illustrations, and advice consulted, and how did these influence this description: Birds of North America, Scott et al. for female, subspecies is probably the eastern, longer-tailed, darker bird, rather than the western Arizona bird as night be expected. Perhaps the route into this area is via the San Juan Dolores rather than the colorado river.
