THERE WERE ONLY A FEW VERY LIGHT TAN STRIPES ON THE SIDES OF THE BREAST. THE BACK WAS ALSO. VERY LIGHT. THE STRIPES ENDED AT THE TOTALLY WHITE RUMP, WHICH WAS VERY EVIDENT WHEN IT FLEW. WHITE WING BARS EVIDENT IN FLIGHT.

MY FIRST THOUGHT WHEN I SAW THIS BIRD WAS THAT IT WAS AN .. ALBINO "SOMETHING". BUT WHEN I SAW THE BRIGHT RED FOREHEAD AND "SMALL" YELLOW BILL, I KNEW IT WAS A REDPOLL. TO ME THERE IS NO QUESTION THAT THIS BIRD WAS A HOARY REDPOLL. THE WHITE UNDER PARTS AND WHITE RUMP ELIMINATES THE COMMON REDPOLL.

What experience have you had with this and similar species: I HAVE OBSERVED BOTH COMMON AND HOARY REDPOLLS IN BOTH ALASKA AND MICHIGAN. I HAVE SEEN COMMON REDPOLLS IN UTAH, INCLUDING ONCE AT MY FEEDER. MY LATE WIFE AND I FOUND THE FIRST KNOWN HOARY REDPOLL NEST ON ATTU ISLAND, ALASKA. THEDE TOBISH CONFIRMED IDENTIFICATION AND LATER PUBLISHED THE RECORD.
